



Be up there from 5:30 on, or drop in any time you choose. Stay over night or just for an hour. There will be grills set up. We'll be supplying hot coffee and iced tea. Bring snacks or serious food, including a little to share, or just come up to observe!!

We'll be observing the sun in white light and H-alpha. The moon will be prominent before midnight. Jupiter will be spectacular then too. Saturn will be best seen in the early morning hours. Once the moon sets the summer Milky way should be great!!

Look through the club's library and atlases to comparison shop before you buy. There will be two computers set up so you can try out some software or take the ASTROQUIZ (Earn a certificate, suitable for taking home to show your Mom!)

Bring up your new scope, learn how to use it. Check out the club's new 8° f/10 Dob-mounted reflector on the moon and planets. Get to use the club's other Newtonian reflector scopes too ---the 6° f/8

If the weather permits we should all have a





PUBLIC NIGHTS AT KEYSTONE OBSERV-ATORY

These will run on Mondays and Wednesdays from July 10 to August 2. There is a different lecture each week, starting at 8:00 PM, rain or clear. In the event of severe thunderstorms or flash flood warnings the session will. be canceled. Call the observatory if you're not sure. Members are encouraged to come on up. Bring a scope if you'd like to help out with the observing session after the lecture. Your help is always appreciated and you'll find that the astro-public is fun to deal with!!
